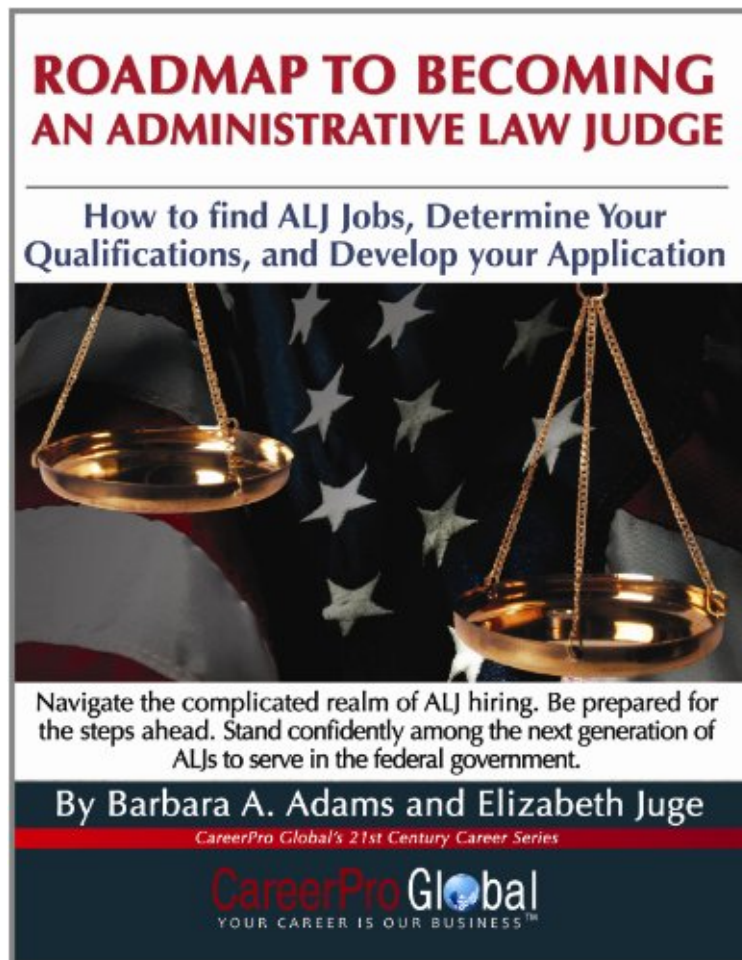

on the process for applying to become an ALJ. It also provides very valuable links so you can research on your own, which are excellent. The book gives an example Federal resume and offers techniques on how to fill out the applications. I would have liked to see more example resumes. The formatting of the book, however, is confusing at times because it is difficult to tell the difference between parts of the forms you are required to fill out and the authors' commentary. I also expected more advice from the book to attorneys in private practice considering an ALJ career. The authors are part of a company that sells resume and other services to ALJ candidates, so I assume that such advice is reserved to those customers. I was disappointed with the example forms, which all assume that those interested in ALJ positions have very extensive military and government experience. I would have liked more content on ALJ process, like which agencies hire through the OPM process and which hire inter-agency, and discussions of different career paths that lead to becoming an ALJ. Even with those weaknesses, though, the book is a solid nuts-and-bolts guide for applying for an ALJ position.
