"Super Thesaurus" is a book that should delight all three groups, at least for a while. "Super Thesaurus" tries to differentiate itself from competitors by being "super". It boast s not only synonyms, but is something of a "reverse dictionary"; poses as a "vocabulary book", a feature of limited value; claims to have quotations that double as synonyms and, for good measure, antonyms. For the very discerning, "Super Thesaurus" does not measure up to the classics such as the original Roget's and Rodale's, but it is fun to use and helpful as well. By way of example, "death" includes familiar synonyms like "demise", slang like "lights out" and the promised quotations, such as "a black camel which kneels at the gates of all". In the "word find" or reverse dictionary entry for

"death", you find morsels like "gurgle at last breath: death rattle". Oddly, here are no antonyms for death listed. You can't be too rich, too beautiful or have too many dictionaries and thesauri. For the low price, this is a fun and useful thesaurus. Jerry
