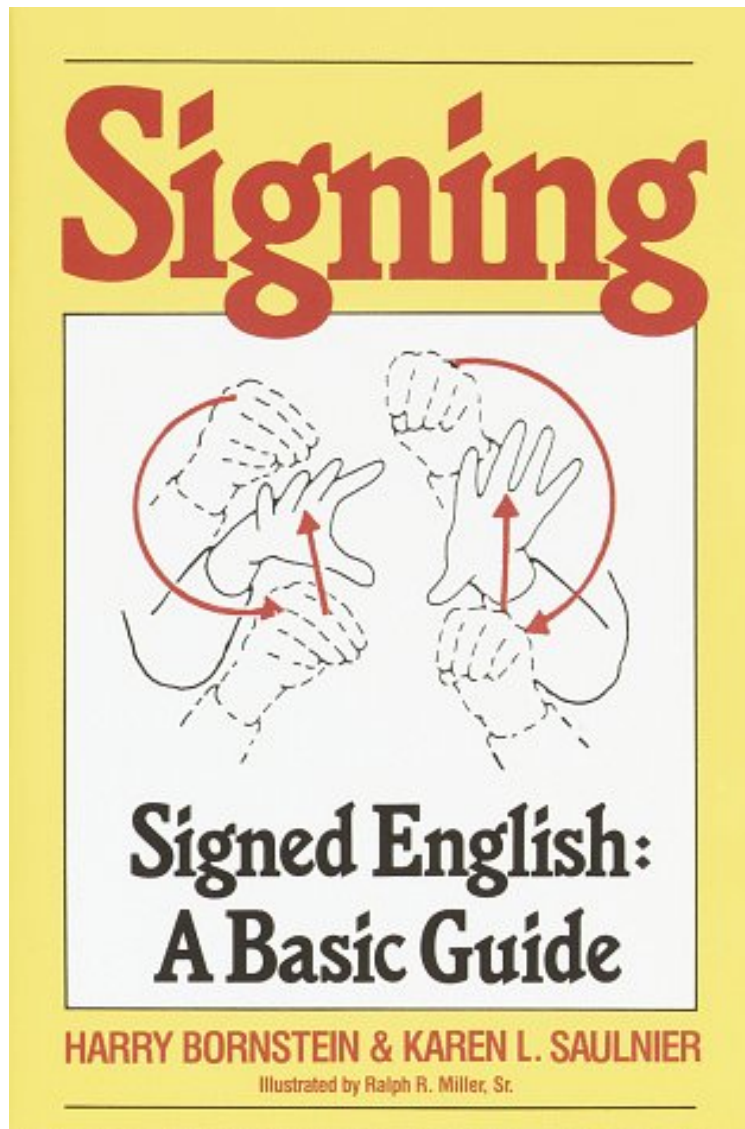

I used this book for research into the differences between ASL, PSE/contact signing, Signed English, and SEE. It gives a good, basic, overview of Signed English, and does a good job differentiating between SE and SEE. It also gives a little information on Bornstein's original framework for using SE to teach English skills and then phasing out some of the cumbersome elements as various

English skills are mastered - ultimately resulting in something akin to PSE (a definite advantage over SEE, which is very, very slow and clunky). I am training to become an ASL interpreter, and I recommend learning ASL if you want to connect with the Deaf community. From scholarly research and anecdotal experiences, a solid bi-lingual education, where ASL and English are both taught thoroughly and separately, as distinct languages, results in the best language outcomes for profoundly Deaf children. But if you're looking to learn a simplified version of visual English, this book will be helpful to you.
