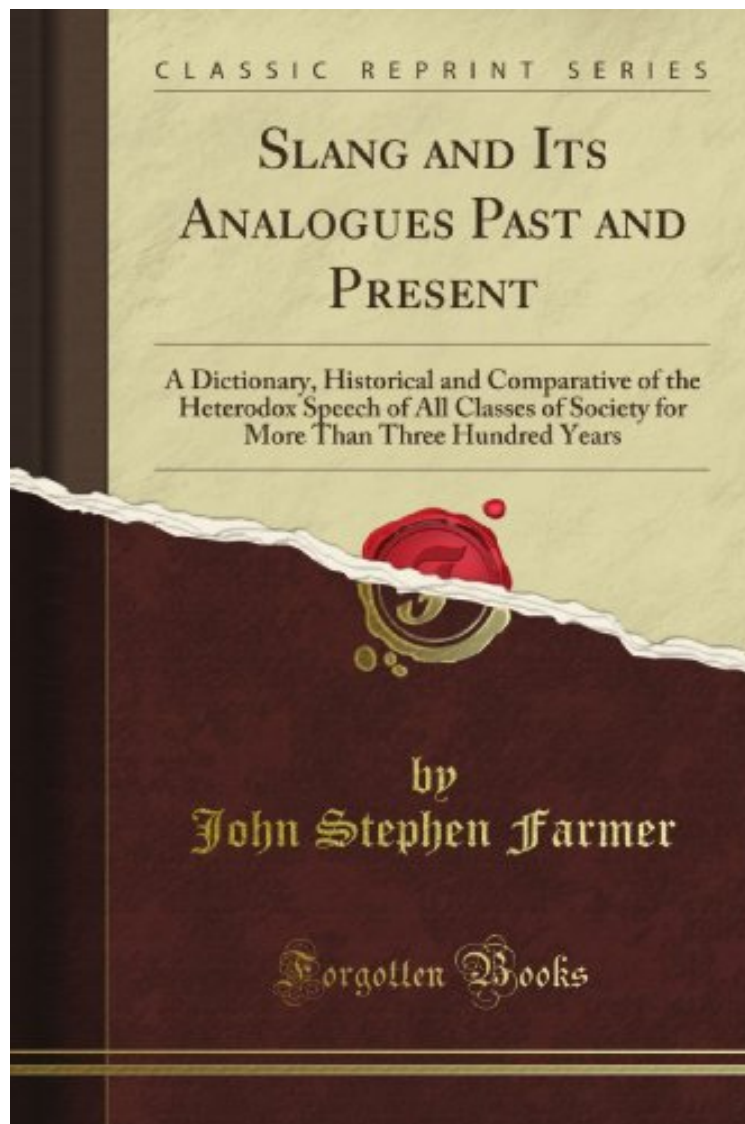

Although not clearly indicated, this is a reprint of only volume 1 (A to Byz.) of a classic multivolume set. If you "click and look inside," you will find the title page where you can actually see that you are only going to purchase a small segment of the original publication. The final page in the actual item states "End of Vol. 1." If you visit the publisher's website, there is no indication that the rest of the volumes will be reprinted to complete the set. Our Library System purchased the book for the reference collection, and now we find it pointless to process it.
