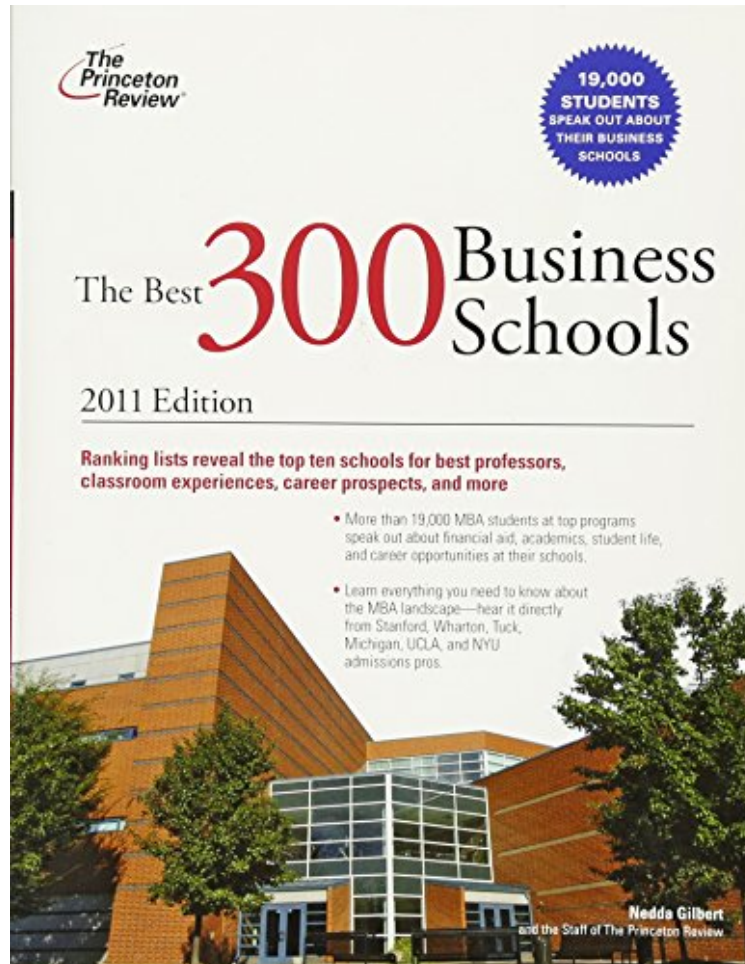

2 of 4 people found the following review helpful. So frustrated By Walter I am so frustrated that I just spent \$25 and 3 hours of my life reading this book. I have found enough factual errors within these pages to completely discredit it, at least in my mind. On page 501 it states that the annual enrollment fees for the University of Maryland are \$17,777 (the school's website claims \$1,683). On page 615 it claims that 27% of University of Wisconsin students receive grants (the school's website states "Over 50 percent of all students receive some merit-based aid in the form of scholarships, fellowships, or assistantships"). On page 415 it claims that 96% of Syracuse MBA students receive grants, with the

average grant being \$23,199 in size. And tuition is \$33,510. Apparently we're all supposed to believe that Syracuse University prints money. Obviously, I bought this book for a very specific purpose--to aggregate and analyze financial aid data. And it has failed me terribly. Maybe it's better if you use it for other things, like general descriptions of the schools or whatever. I don't know. 0 of 3 people found the following review helpful.
