If you don't own a machine, it helps you decide which machine will best fit your needs. Whether you have your machine or not, the book goes into detail on the two main companies' machines, Sizzix and Accuquilt. The two most valuable sections of this book for me are 1) What

dies are compatible with the various machines and what adapters are needed to use other companies' dies on your machine and 2) How to properly use your machine for the best results to include which way to feed the grain, fold, and the die itself. Bonus information includes many handy tips such as how to get the most life out of the cutting mats, how to mark your dies with a silver marker for ultimate ease in fabric placement and reduced waste; suggested dies to purchase first; and ways to use strip dies to create some basic geometric shapes. It's compact size and spiral binding makes it handy to keep near. As the author points out, it would be impossible to provide all possible shape combinations for the thousands of various block patterns that exist, but I would have liked to have seen a few sample block patterns with lists of dies needed to help get started with my die collection. The book describes a method (EDeN) to help identify shapes in patterns so that might be helpful once I dig into dipper. Overall, well worth the purchase!!!!
