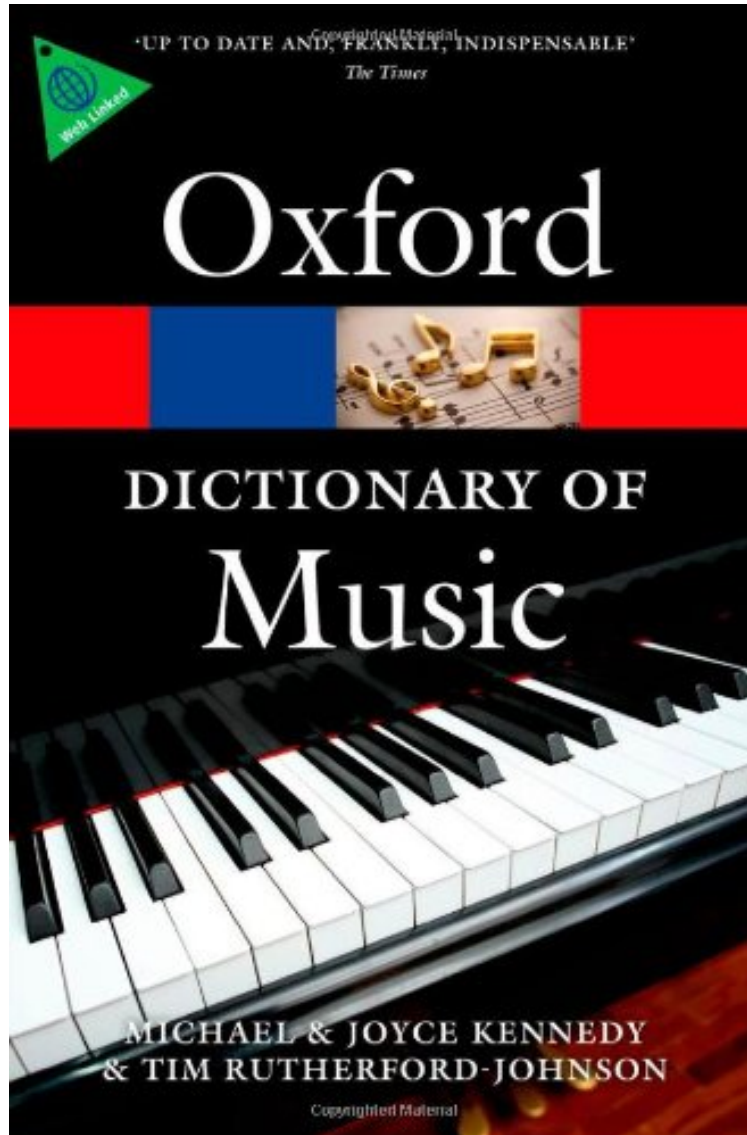

is amazingly complete, and most every composer, major works of music, and musical terms are included. The entries are described with ABC, accuracy, brevity, and clarity. The font is very readable (for me, with glasses, but the imperfection is in my eyes, not the book!). Entries are easy to find because of their grey tab indexing system. Some major entries such as "symphony" have an entire page devoted to them. The dictionary now also includes two useful appendices, one listing French, German, and Italian musical terms with their English translations, and an abbreviations list for letters commonly used in musical scores and musical writing. The Oxford Dictionary of Music is the most up-to-date and accessible dictionary of musical terms available and an essential point of reference for music students, teachers, lecturers, professional musicians, and music enthusiasts.
